

RESOLUTION
EXPRESSING THE PROFOUND SYMPATHY AND SINCERE CONDOLENCES OF
THE SENATE ON THE DEATH OF REVERED STATESMAN FROM NUEVA VIZCAYA
GOV. CARLOS PADILLA

WHEREAS, Gov. Carlos Padilla passed away at age 78 on May 5, 2023. He was laid to rest on Saturday, May 13, 2023, in this Dupax del Norte, Nueva Vizcaya, where he served as the first mayor in the early 1970s and where his storied political career began;

WHEREAS, Gov. Padilla was a beloved and respected member of the Philippine political community, known for his kindness, generosity, and dedication to public service;

WHEREAS, Gov. Padilla served with distinction and dedication, and worked tirelessly to improve the lives of Filipinos, especially his fellow Novo Vizcayanons;

WHEREAS, Representing the province Nueva Vizcaya, Padilla served Congress for 29 years as assemblyman and congressman in various capacities;¹

WHEREAS, as Education Committee chairman, he authored the landmark law *Free High School Act of 1988* (R.A. No. 6655) that guaranteed free high school education for every Filipino, and R.A. No. 6728, providing various forms of government assistance to students and teachers in private education. Gov. Padilla is widely regarded as "Father of Free Public Secondary Education;"

WHEREAS, as governor of Nueva Vizcaya, he was recognized for his utmost care for the environment and agriculture, community development, initiatives on good governance and welfare of indigenous peoples, among others;

WHEREAS, the National Roundtable against Metals Mining in El Salvador and International Allies of the Roundtable described Gov. Padilla as “a visionary environmental leader.” They extended their gratitude to the Philippines “for sharing Governor Padilla with us;”²

WHEREAS, Gov. Padilla was crucial in the historic vote of the Salvadoran legislature banning metals mining to protect rivers. In his own province, he was vocal against the presence of Australian mining company OceanaGold Philippines Incorporated and questioned the sustainability and benefits of mining;³


WHEREAS, Gov. Padilla was a devoted husband, father, and grandfather, who will be greatly missed by his family, friends, and colleagues;


